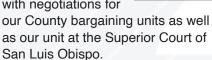

## Tentative Agreement Reached With The County What Comes Next?

he past few months have been busy ones for SLOCEA, with negotiations for



#### **COUNTY OF SAN LUIS OBISPO**

We are also pleased to announce that after months of dedicated bargaining, your SLOCEA Negotiating Team has reached a tentative agreement (TA) with the County of San Luis Obispo. This marks a critical step forward in securing fair wages, benefits, and working conditions for our members. While we are proud of the progress reflected in this agreement, the process is not yet complete. Final adoption requires **member** ratification and approval by the County Board of Supervisors, and your participation in the next steps is essential.

#### WHAT A TENTATIVE AGREEMENT MEANS

A tentative agreement is exactly what it sounds like - it is tentative until the members have had the chance to review it and vote. The TA represents the best outcome achievable through bargaining at the table with the County. Now, the decision moves to you, the membership, who hold the ultimate authority to accept or reject it. This is one of the most

powerful rights you exercise as union members - your ability to determine the terms of your own employment.

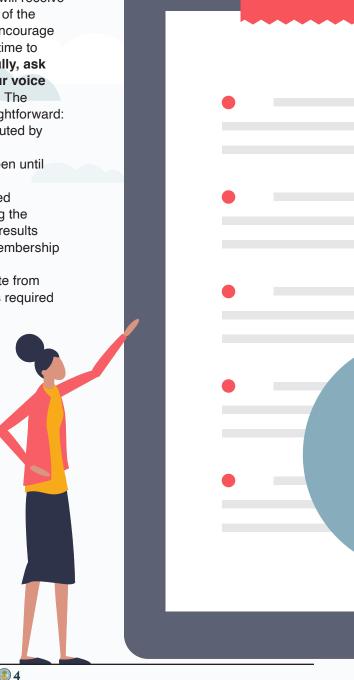
#### **BALLOTS AND RATIFICATION**

In the coming days, you will receive a ballot with the full details of the tentative agreement. We encourage every member to take the time to read the materials carefully, ask questions, and make your voice heard through your vote. The ratification process is straightforward:

- Ballots will be distributed by mail late next week.
- Voting will remain open until October 20, 2025.
- Ballots will be counted immediately following the close of voting, with results announced to the membership shortly thereafter.
- A simple majority vote from those participating is required for ratification. If the TA is ratified, it moves forward to the County Board of Supervisors for final approval. If the TA is not ratified, negotiations may return to the table.

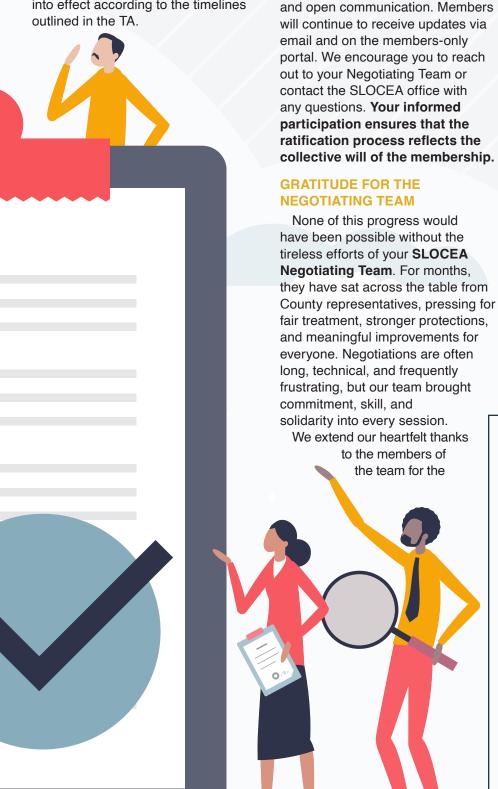
#### BOARD OF SUPERVISORS APPROVAL

approval. This is a procedural step, but it is required for the agreement to become official. Once approved, the provisions of the agreement will go into effect according to the timelines outlined in the TA

## Why We Need More Stewards In The Workplace

I serve as the staff liaison over the Steward Committee, a very important committee of members that plays a vital role in the union. Stewards are the bridge between members and SLOCEA staff, and they are essential in keeping SLOCEA strong, visible, and effective in departments and workplaces throughout the County.

A Steward is often the first point of contact for members who have questions, need support, or want to better understand their rights under the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Whether it's answering a quick workplace question or attending a meeting and sharing important updates, Stewards play a vital role in making sure members feel informed and supported. They are the eyes and ears of our union at the worksite, ensuring that members have someone to turn to quickly when issues arise.

Contract negotiations is a time when having strong communication between the union and our membership is more critical than ever. Stewards help ensure that members know what's happening at the bargaining table and how they can show support for the bargaining team and process. The stronger our network of Stewards, the stronger our collective voice is during negotiations.

That's one reason we are actively recruiting more Stewards. While some worksites have well-established Steward representation, some

departments don't have anyone serving in this vital role. If your workplace doesn't currently have a Steward, we encourage you to consider stepping forward. Even if you're unsure, becoming a Steward is a great way to learn more about SLOCEA, strengthen your connection with your coworkers, and gain skills

that will benefit you professionally.

To be appointed to the Steward Committee, you must be a SLOCEA member for at least one year and obtain signatures of support from your co-workers. Once appointed by our Board of Directors, you'll join our team that meets virtually on the second Thursday of every other month from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. These meetings are designed to keep Stewards informed, connected, and supported, while being mindful of busy work schedules. The meetings give Stewards the chance to hear union updates, discuss workplace issues, share strategies, and learn more about the rights of public employees. It's also a great opportunity to build relationships with SLOCEA staff and fellow members across different

departments and job classifications.

You don't need to have prior experience to serve as a Steward—just a willingness to learn and a commitment to supporting your fellow members. SLOCEA provides training, resources, and ongoing guidance. Many of our Stewards have developed leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills that have carried over into them serving SLOCEA in even greater leadership roles.

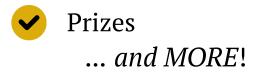

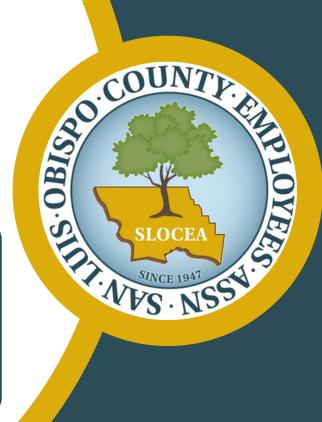

If you do not take action during Open Enrollment, your current benefits will automatically roll over, except waiving medical coverage or funding a tax savings account.

If you waive County medical coverage, you must upload Proof of Other Group Coverage in BenXcel. net. Review your MOU for Proof of Other Group Coverage eligibility and requirements for waiving County medical insurance.

This topic is important to retirees who receive their healthcare insurance through the county. Esmeralda will speak about changes in the county Health and Prescription plans for the coming year.

My husband was hospitalized for nearly two months in two different facilities so Medicare and our secondary plan insurance coverage were dealt with and utilized more than ever before. We are fortunate to have very good coverage, but the threat of long term care loomed and those costs are not included. Thankfully he is currently recovering well at home; not many people can afford convalescent care out of pocket.

#### **DIFFERENCES IN PEACE**

I finish this with thoughts of our present human condition overall in the country. These are troubling times for many politically and economically.

The 2025 Global Peace index notes that peacefulness has declined for the sixth consecutive year. #### CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS (SUPERIOR COURT)

SLOCEA and the Superior Court reached a Tentative Agreement for a successor MOU on September 19, 2025, following five bargaining sessions. Ballots were sent out to Unit 19 members and the Tentative Agreement was approved and ratified.

## ACTIVE PERB (PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD) MATTERS

April 2024: SHERIFF DEPT – SLOCEA filed a charge against the County's failure to meet and confer over elimination of Supervising Correctional Technician positions and assigning supervisory duties to Correctional Technicians.

PERB issued a complaint against County which is currently being held in abeyance, pending settlement between the parties

#### February 2025: SHERIFF DEPT

- SLOCEA filed a charge against the County's for interfering with an employee's protected rights and for retaliation against an employee.
- PERB issued a Complaint against the County on July 9, 2025
- SLOCEA and the County reached a FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT for the employee and the PERB charge was withdrawn by SLOCEA.

#### March 2025: SHERIFF DEPT -

SLOCEA filed an unfair practice charge against the County citing the Sheriff's elimination of the 3-11 p.m. shift for Correctional Technicians that was tied to a 5% evening differential.

- The County filed their position statement on May 8, 2025
- PERB issued a Complaint against the County on August 15, 2025
- PERB is currently seeking to schedule an informal conference for the parties
